COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Certified Nurse Assistant Training Program is designed to prepare students for employment as a Nurse Assistant in a variety of settings. Students will learn patient care, observation, and communication skills with an emphasis on caring for the geriatric resident in a long term care facility. This class prepares students to take the State Competency Exam required for certification. 100 mandatory hours of worksite learning (clinical training) is included.

Orientation, background and health clearance, negative TB tests, and current influenza vaccination.

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TRI-CITIES ROP NON-DISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in the district's academic and other educational support programs, services, and activities. SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS STATEMENT (SAP) FOR VETERANS AND ELIGIBLE PERSONS REIMBURSEMENT:

Students are required to maintain at least a 71% grade average to remain in class. When a student's grade average falls below 71% for one month, the instructor will verbally counsel the student and inform the program Director. The program Director will also counsel the student and, when the student is a minor, send a written warning to their home address. If the student fails to achieve a 71% or better grade average during the next month of instruction, they will be dropped from the class and the Veterans Administration will be promptly notified. If a student previously dropped because of unsatisfactory progress wishes to re-enroll in the same class they will be given credit only for those instructional sections in which they achieved a 71% grade or better. In some cases credits cannot be granted because of State Certification requirements. Grading Policy: 100% to 91%=A; 90% to 81%=B; 80% to 71%=C; 70% to 61%=D; 60% or lower=F

CONDITIONS FOR DISMISSAL DUE TO UNSATISFACTORY CONDUCT FOR VETERANS AND ELIGIBLE PERSONS REIMBURSEMENT:

All students, and parents of minor students, must read and sign the Tri-Cities ROP Student Rules of Conduct form. A student's inability to comply with the Student Rules of Conduct form may result in discipline, including, but not limited to, immediate dismissal from Tri-Cities ROP. For minor offences the student will be counseled by the instructor and program Director. If an adult student continues the behavior they will be asked to leave the class. If they are a high school student the high school administration will be notified and the school's discipline procedures will be applied.
