



The following is a quick glimpse at what took place during the August 14, 2025 Board Meeting:

\*The Board approved the following travel on school business:

- (1) <u>CSU Counselor Conference</u>, September 30, 2025, Pasadena, California. Attending: Bianca Aguirre, CTE Counselor; David Belis, Elsa Cabral, Mayra Campos, Jonathan Olmedo, and Jacqueline Ramirez, College & Career Pathways Advisors.
- (2) <u>CTE Annual Fall Conference</u>, November 19-21, 2025, Rancho Mirage, California. Attending: Dr. John Smith, Superintendent; Daniel Barajas, Director of Programs, Technology, and Operations; Kathi Kent, Director of Educational Services; and Candice Marsano, WBL and Pathway Coordinator.
- \*The Board ratified/approved the Grant Sub-Agreement with Pasadena Area Community College District regarding the K12 Strong Workforce Program Pathway Improvement Pathway Coordinators.
